



URGE Resource Map for UWM Geoscience

This is a draft resource map for Panther Geoscience at the University of Wisconsin–Milwaukee. The goal of this document is to provide resources to BIPOC (black, indigenous, and people of color) that will support their well-being and success in the Geoscience discipline. Such resources will help BIPOC in geoscience cope with racism-related stress or racial trauma. Some resources will be common to all, while others will be more specific based on the needs and interests of the individual.

While there are many resources in this document, it is recognized that this list is not comprehensive or reflective of everything available in the UWM and Milwaukee community. We encourage users of this document to add resources that are not included in this list.

- <u>State of Wisconsin Student Diversity Internship Program</u> A program offering paid internships with the Department of Natural Resources in the State of Wisconsin.

- <u>STEMSEAS</u> STEMSEAS aims to provide ship-based, 6-10 day exploratory experiences for undergraduates from diverse backgrounds aboard NSF-funded research vessels.
 Students will sail with experienced faculty mentors and engage in geoscience and oceanography activities (while also having fun)!
