



URGE Resource Map for University of Alaska Fairbanks - Deliverable 7

This is a draft Resource Map for The UAF URGE Pod at University of Alaska Fairbanks. This was adapted from the "Sample Ph.D. Mentoring Plan" developed by Vashan Wright (Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution) and Karin Block (City College of New York and CUNY Graduate Center), License: <u>CC BY-NC-SA 4.0</u>. Some of these will be resources common to all and some will be questions for identifying specific resources based on needs/interests identified during initial meetings while implementing the mentoring plan.

• Mentoring plan

- The UAF Graduate School has a Graduate Advising Handbook that details mutual expectations and how to set them: <u>https://uaf.edu/gradschool/forms/document_student_forms/Handbook_Advisor.pdf</u>
- New faculty can expect to be set up by a mentor via their unit dean or director. Informal mentoring relationships as well as training opportunities (eg. on how to be a committee member/graduate advisor as well as pedagogy) are available via the Faculty Accelerator site <u>https://facdev.uaf.edu/</u>
- Evaluations: Students meet with their full graduate committee at least once a year, but meet with advisors more regularly (monthly to weekly).
- First year of graduate school involves making a graduate study plan, as well as a self-evaluation of progress and a timeline for degree completion.

- Conference and workshop participation

Advisors may add travel costs to grants. If students are on Research Assistantships, there is often money included for at least one conference. Teaching Assistantships, on the other hand, do not cover research related expenses.

 - If students do not have travel funds included in their contracts, finding funding may require some searching around, but for the motivated student there is generally some sort of financial assistance available.
 - Academic advisors may be able to help their students find funds that are available, or help the student apply for scholarships, etc. (Additionally, learning skills to find money to support your work is an integral part of graduate school and necessary for any (not just academic!) future work).

URGE Pod Recommendations

- A "The Well" set up just for BIPOC to use if they want to (AKA a Safe Space) as well as them being welcome to use the original Well.
- Create a fund that lets BIPOC students participate in outdoor adventure events for free/covers their costs.
- Create a separate BIPOC-only emergency student fund.
- UAF should make it a top priority to hire BIPOC mental health counselors. BIPOC issues should be called out directly / recognized in the list of issues potentially requiring counseling.
- Outline opportunities, expectations, benefits, and/or compensation for mentoring new hires and/or students who wish to engaged in belonging, accessibility, justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion (Be A JEDI) efforts
- Develop a plan to connect new BIPOC students/staff with pre-existing BIPOC faculty, acknowledging the time tax of such service for existing BIPOC faculty.
- Explicitly acknowledge, discuss, and suggest policies to limit the "time tax" put on people of color for participation in Be A JEDI activities and support clear path for opting out

- Information on honoraria and establishing/charging speaker fees
- Support DEI conference participation: normalize and encourage participation in transdisciplinary workshops/ groups/ meetings (i.e., IAGD, SACNAS, NABG, AISES, GeoLatinas, etc.). Share meeting details and deadline reminders, similar to how GSA/ AGU are approached.
