 - In crises: for emergency assistance to students:
 - Having suicidal thoughts by providing emergency hotlines and counselling and psychological services (remote due to COVID-19)
 - Mental health crises: walk in virtual hours
 - Sexual assault/intimate partner violence and stalking: provide 24hr hotlines, lists of confidential resources on campus and links to make appointment with CARE advocates <u>https://care.ucr.edu/</u>. care advocates provide assistance such as changes in living arrangements, work situations, safety planning and reporting methods without formally reporting an act of sexual violence
 - Psychotherapy and psychiatric services
 - Ongoing counselling is available and medical treatment by a psychiatrist at the UCR health center
 - Therapy assistance online (TAO):
 - TAO Connect, Inc. is committed to reducing mental health disparities by bringing affordable, effective, and accessible treatment to people who have had limited access in the past.
