Further, we are committed to our pod's objectives:

- 1. Discuss and assess the racial justice, equity, and inclusivity of our department at Wash U
- 2. Develop an anti-racism action plan with actions specific to issues in EPSc, including methods for measuring and reporting progress.

We are committed to pursuing these objectives individually, as a pod, and as a department.

The pod requests that department leaders meet with us to discuss our pod goals, and meet again at the end of the URGE program to discuss a proposed plan of action and implementation of anti-racist policies in the department. Meetings will occur at mutually agreed-upon times on Zoom. Department leaders are also invited to join one of our regular pod meetings, which are scheduled for alternate Wednesdays from 9 to 10am.
